

Tech High Capstone Proposal

Student Letter – Proposal / Introduction & Overview

A one page over view of the entire project from beginning to end. What it will include, what you are creating, what research you intend to undertake to create this final project, what industry feedback you may be soliciting for additional help or resources, a time line of how long this will take, etc..

The Timeline

A detailed breakdown of how long this will take, when we will meet for reviews and feedback and when it should be completed by. There should be three stages of review.

The first will be a review of your student letter - proposal.

The second will be a review of your artwork and project as you near completion of first drafts of your designs.

The third will be a final review of your designs after any changes / additions / subtractions are made.

The last portion will be your presentation (*see below)

The Research

The research will have you detailing exactly what assets you need to complete the project as well as the scope of the design.

The Service Learning Portion

This will require you to go outside of the class and solicit feedback. This may require you to contact advisory members or industry people who will be able to review and help you.

The Presentation

You will be presenting your capstone project to a panel of peers, staff, industry people and family. Your parents and friends will be invited to come view your final presentation and to look over your portfolio. This shouldn't take more than an two hours and will coincide will occur in April..

The Portfolio

Your final physical portfolio and digital portfolio should be a broad representation of your skillsets. Any honors, accolades, certifications or awards of merit should be represented within. Between 10 – 15 pieces. Your best work should be presented first and you should be able to easily describe motivations and specifics about your design if asked. This will be included in the Capstone night as applicable.
